Code Update Training Required for Master Electricians by Dec 31

The Safety Codes Council (Council) believes that ongoing training is in the best interest of public safety for Albertans in a time when technological innovations are happening at a faster rate than ever. On January 1, 2016, code update training became a requirement for renewal for all Master Electricians, beginning with the 2015 Canadian Electrical Code. Master Electricians are required to complete a Council-approved course and submit a copy of their certificate by December 31, 2016. ECAA's Code Update course is approved for Master Electricians and Safety Codes Officers.

News from Alberta Construction Association

Alberta Infrastructure Answers Concerns Regarding Drywall

Due to the changes in the tariffs on gypsum, ACA and the Alberta Wall and Ceiling Association reached out to Alberta Infrastructure (AI) to discuss what will happen with the increasing prices of material.

AI completed a detailed review of their standard forms of contract. They have concluded that the contracts include provisions to ensure that where Tariff increases occur during the course of a contract, the direct cost associated to the Tariff are to be passed onto AI for payment.

In this regard, it is only the direct cost of the Tariff that is eligible for payment. All other costs such as general increases, mark-ups or overhead and profit are

not to be applied.

ACA Attends Infrastructure Announcement

The Alberta government held a media conference on October 11 where Transportation Minister and Infrastructure Minister Brian Mason summarized the impact of 2016 infrastructure projects. The focus was on the investment government is making in infrastructure all across the province - an investment that has seen a number of projects being completed this year and one that will continue with the many projects that are currently underway.

Vice Chair Chris Ambrozic attended the media conference on behalf of the association. As well he addressed the media regarding ACA's policies and how critical construction is for the provincial economy.

Government investment this year includes:

- \$80-million Gaetz/QEII interchange project in Red Deer, which will support 300 jobs
- The Southwest Calgary Ring Road
- The University of Lethbridge Destination project.

Alberta Government Adopts Seven New Safety Codes

The Government of Alberta has updated or adopted seven new codes, including building, energy, electrical, elevating devices, gas, pressure vessels and private sewage. All of these codes include energy-efficiency improvements to help the province reduce its overall greenhouse gas emissions.

The codes also apply to all other new buildings, including commercial, industrial and high-rise buildings. They allow for the safe use of new technologies that reduce energy waste and combat climate change. For example, elevator devices codes now allow for variable speed escalators and moving walks. When the demand or traffic is not present, the device senses this and will slow down to a neutral speed with minimum energy use.

Starting Nov. 1

, all new homes and buildings in Alberta must be built to meet or exceed the updated codes. Alberta's Safety Codes Council has been providing training to inspectors across the province to help them transition to the new codes. For more information see the links below.

Energy Efficiency Alberta will promote and support energy efficiency and

community energy systems (including micro-generation and small-scale generation) for homes, businesses and communities. Initial programs include a Direct Install Residential Program, a Residential Consumer Products Program and a Business Non-Profit and Institutional Rebate Program.

* Direct Install Residential Program will offer direct, no-charge installation of low-cost energy efficiency products to residences, such as lighting, water and heating components.

* Residential Consumer Products Program will offer point of sale rebates to residential customers at retail outlets with products such as lighting, insulation and appliances.

* Business, Non-Profit and Institutional Rebate Program will offer incentives for high-efficiency products and installation of electric and gas based products such as lighting, heating and cooling systems and hot water systems.

The course uses the Sask Polytech Carpentry curriculum to navigate through the National Occupational Analysis for the Carpenter Trade (N.O.A). The Interprovincial Journeyman Exam (Red Seal) is an exam based on the N.O.A. The Sask Polytech Carpentry curriculum has been developed using the N.O.A as its template but is geared for Apprenticeship Training.

[Alberta Government Announces New Apprenticeship Support Program](#)

A new unemployed apprentice training program was announced by the government on October 20. A total of \$1.5 million will be made available to assist as many as 1,500 eligible apprentices during the 2016-17 academic year. Eligible apprentices will receive \$1,000 to help reduce financial barriers and support them to progress towards their journeyman certification.

To receive the award, eligible apprentices must not be working in their trade and must have successfully completed their first period of technical training. They must also be registered for technical training at a post-secondary institution or other training partner. Apprentices who meet the criteria will be identified and contacted by government. The award will be distributed to eligible apprentices starting in January 2017.

ONLINE TRAINING

Arc Flash & Shock Electrical Safety Training based on CSA Z462-2015 Developed for workers that perform energized electrical work. The course curriculum is based on the 3rd edition of CSA Z462, published in 2015. The overall course content was developed using industry accepted best practice standards as the under pinning in support of meeting Provincial or Federal regulatory due diligence for arc flash and shock.

ESTS Electrical Worker training is focused on the practical application of CSA Z462 within the workplace and providing documentation tools in support of the Employer's overall Occupational Health & Safety Management System and an Electrical Safety Program. Employers are required to have an updated Electrical Safety Program that incorporates the new requirements from CSA Z462-2015 for workers to receive the most benefit from this course.

The ESTS Electrical Worker course is broken down into five sections for ease of use. Workers should self-pace themselves based on their understanding of the subject matter. All workers are encouraged to stop and start their course by saving their progress before exiting. At any time during the course workers can ask questions to an Instructor and follow along using a comprehensive Student Workbook as a training aid.
