**Occupational Healthy & Safety (OH&S) NEWS AND UPDATES.** Public input sought on workplace health and safety rules. Albertans are invited to share their thoughts on proposed changes to Alberta's Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Code. The OHS Code documents the specific rules and requirements governing health and safety practices in the workplace. As part of a regular review of Alberta's OHS Code, Albertans can share their views by completing an [online survey](#).

"This review is part of the regular business of making sure our health and safety rules keep pace with best practices. Albertans drive our economy - we want to hear from them. ## Labour

The proposed changes will update the OHS Code for the next five years. Feedback is also being sought on a variety of areas, including issues such as:

- Bullying and harassment in the workplace
- Health and safety management systems in the oil and gas sector
- Workplace air quality
- Underground mines

Significant parts of the OHS Code are updated approximately every five years, to ensure the rules governing workplace health and safety keep pace with changes in industry and technology. In addition to the online survey, ongoing consultations have been held with various stakeholders since 2011. The survey will be open until January 31, 2015.

**Alberta OH&S planning on adopting two Clauses from CSA Z462-12 in OH&S Law** in Part 18 Personal Protective Equipment: CSA Z462-12, Clause 4.3.7.3.11 and Clause 4.3.7.3.12 will be formally recognized under Alberta OH&S Part 18 Personal Protective Equipment, 232 Use of flame resistant clothing. Public Comment process has been opened and will close January 2015.

Following this process the Alberta Provincial Government will consider all proposed changes and if this Part 18 proposal is accepted would be adopted into the OH&S Regulations in late 2015. **The new proposed language is: Part 18 Personal Protective Equipment 232 (1.2) If a worker may be exposed to electrical arc flash, an employer must ensure that the worker wears clothing that meets the requirements of:**(a) **ASTM F1506-10a Standard Performance Specification for Flame Resistant and Arc Rated Textile Materials for Wearing Apparel for Use by Electrical Workers Exposed to Momentary Electric Arc and Related Thermal Hazards and (b) CSA Z462-12 Workplace Electrical Safety, Section 4.3.7.3.11 and 4.3.7.3.12** Links of interest to review and provide comment on the proposed changes: Part 18, s.232.
