Arc Flash & Shock Electrical Safety Training based on CSA Z462-2015 Developed for workers that perform energized electrical work. The course curriculum is based on the 3rd edition of CSA Z462, published in 2015. The overall course content was developed using industry accepted best practice standards as the under pinning in support of meeting Provincial or Federal regulatory due diligence for arc flash and shock.

ESTS Electrical Worker training is focused on the practical application of CSA Z462 within the workplace and providing documentation tools in support of the Employer's overall Occupational Health & Safety Management System and an Electrical Safety Program. Employers are required to have an updated Electrical Safety Program that incorporates the new requirements from CSA Z462-2015 for workers to receive the most benefit from this course.

The ESTS Electrical Worker course is broken down into five sections for ease of use. Workers should self-pace themselves based on their understanding of the subject matter. All workers are encouraged to stop and start their course by saving their progress before exiting. At any time during the course workers can ask questions to an Instructor and follow along using a comprehensive Student Workbook as a training aid.

Alberta Construction Association Update

Workplace Violence and Harassment Policy Guidelines Online

On June 1, Alberta's updated OHS laws will include new guidelines around the definitions of harassment, including sexual and domestic violence, and increased protections from violence and harassment. As part of the outreach on this issue the government has published handbooks for employers and employees. This outline is a starting point, OHS is offering webinars [here](#). Clarity on New Labour Code Offers Additional Flexibility for Employees. As reported in last week's newsletter, ACA along with a number of partner associations met with Minister Gray regarding the lack of flexibility in hours of work averaging agreements. Based on dialogue with Employment Standards in a follow-up meeting, ACA wishes to advise employers an averaging agreement period can be for up to 12 weeks, and this period can repeat for up to two years before a new agreement is required. Please refer to section 23.1 of the Employment Standards Code (Code) and also information found on the Employment Standards website at this [link](#). While averaging agreements require a work schedule, the schedule may be varied due to a variety of factors beyond the control of the employer, including weather (Section 16).

Government Discusses Code Changes with Industry. Last week, Alberta Construction Association (ACA) led a group of construction industry associations into a meeting with the Labour Minister to discuss how changes to employment standards are negatively impacting our workforce ([see letter](#)). ACA and our partner associations noted that weather

dependencies, remote locations and project-based work make it difficult for workers to achieve the number of hours of work and work-life balance.

A follow-up meeting takes place this week. ACA remains committed to working to get commitments from government that is best for our members and employees.

WCB Changes Arriving In September. As result of legislation passed last year there are a number of changes to the WCB some of which go into effect September 1, 2018.

First is the [Code of Rights and Conduct](#) which articulates the rights of workers and employers in their interactions with the WCB and how they commit to operate in recognition of these rights.

Second, the establishment of employers' obligation to return injured workers to work (and workers' responsibility to cooperate). Find out what the employer obligations are via this [fact sheet](#).

Third, continuing coverage for injured workers under their employers' existing health benefits program. Learn more in the WCB employer fact sheet.

Finally, a provision of interim relief for workers and employers while their matters are under review or appeal. This is financial support provided in exceptional circumstances where financial hardship is demonstrated. For more information read the [employer fact sheet](#).
