On average, members can expect to meet four times per year, but this fluctuates depending upon the technical discipline and workload. Meetings are held on weekdays in Edmonton and generally last from 9:00 am - 4:00 pm. Apprenticeship Update

Enhanced Compliance: Apprenticeship & Industry Training/Occupational Health & Safety

What is Enhanced Compliance?

Alberta Labour, Occupational Health & Safety (OHS) has a long-standing relationship with Advanced Education -Apprenticeship & Industry Training (AIT). The two ministries will strengthen their relationship by moving forward with an enhanced apprenticeship compliance initiative. **Effective September 20, 2018** the Enhanced compliance initiative will provide OHS Officers with another tool to improve worker safety, while at the same time increasing compliance under the Apprenticeship & Industry Training (AIT) Act. Enhanced compliance authorized delegated OHS Officers to expand their authority to review, report and enforce specific section of the AIT Act on jobsites in Alberta.

What section of the AIT Act can OHS enforce?

Delegated OHS Officers will have authority for specific regulations and sections of the AIT Act:

- Confirming eligibility to work in a compulsory trade (Sections 21(3) & (4))
- Employment of a person in a designated trade (Section 26)
- Impeding an Officer (Section 51(1))

Program regulations:

- Confirming ratios of journey person to apprentice (Section 15 Apprenticeship Program Regulation, AR 258/2000)
- Appropriate supervision (Section 16)

What trades will apply to Enhanced Compliance?

Apprenticeship compulsory trades that will be enforced under the new Enhanced Compliance initiative include:

- Crane and Hoisting Equipment Operator
- Electrician
- Elevator Constructor\Gasfitter
- Heavy Equipment Technician
- Ironworker
- Plumber
- Refrigeration & Air Conditioning Mechanic
- Sheet metal Worker
- Welder

How will an OHS Officer separate competency and compliance?

Training and support by AIT is fundamental in providing an OHS Officer the necessary expertise to evaluate trades compliance. The main priority of OHS is to ensure every workplace throughout Alberta is safe and healthy. They only have the authority to enforce specific section of the AIT Act when appropriate.

Chapter Presidents and Committee Chairs provided reports (see Issue 3 Contactor in mail next week).

Meeting concluded with tour of STARS base - thank you to Sheyanne Levall-Crouse for making this happen.
