Electrical Safety Program "Product in a Box"

What are the most significant changes in CSA Z462 in the 2018 Edition? In addition to the changes related to Arc Flash Risk Assessment, the energized work task's Shock Risk Assessment has an identical requirement.

1. Identify if the work task will expose a QEW to shock.
2. Then complete the risk assessment to determine the potential for injury or damage to health and the likelihood of occurrence of exposure to shock.
3. Determine additional protective measures to reduce the residual risk to an acceptable level.

The Alberta Government has set up a new policy for contractors bidding on major infrastructure and transportation projects, requiring

them to use apprentices in the 11 construction related trades. The new policy requires apprentices to participate on major public projects valued over \$15 million, or those that will require at least two years to complete. As well, sub-contracts of \$500,000 or greater, will also be required to comply with the new requirement and employ at least one apprentice. The government says about 80 per cent of an apprentice's training is done on the job under the supervision of a certified journeyman or qualified individual. "Apprentices will tell you that real-world experience and mentorship are invaluable to their training and development," said Glenn Feltham, President of the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology. "This is an important initiative that recognizes the value of supporting apprentices and apprenticeship training on publicly funded projects."

Quorum was met.

ECAA had been approached by Energy Efficiency Alberta to conduct an introductory presentation on solar across the Province. Mr. Joel Fundytus (who teaches solar at the Training Center and has spoken at a number of ECAA Training Days) will be the presenter. The Alberta Energy Summit is May 15-16 at the Grey Eagle in Calgary. ECAA will be a gold sponsor. Electrical Trade Definitions were discussed. Edmonton Construction Association (ECA) has been tasked to review the Trade Definitions by Alberta Construction Association (ACA). Invitation received to attend the Alberta Apprenticeship & Industry Training (AIT) Board

Awards. ECAA will continue to sponsor the Top Electrical Apprentice award.

60/90 overdue accounts and Wood Gundy investments reviewed. Second notices will be sent regarding unpaid memberships dues. ASSESSING & FINALIZING THE TENDER WITH COMPUTER ESTIMATING (Chris Reinert, PEC) Thursday, March 15th, 16th & 17th, 2018 (Edmonton)

Arc Flash & Shock Electrical Safety Training based on CSA Z462-2015 Developed for workers that perform energized electrical work. The course curriculum is based on the 3rd edition of CSA Z462, published in 2015. The overall course content was developed using industry accepted best practice standards as the under pinning in support of meeting Provincial or Federal regulatory due diligence for arc flash and shock.

[Public Review is Now Open For CSA A23.1 and A23.2](#)The CSA A23.1 & A23.2-2019 Edition draft: Concrete Materials and Methods of Concrete Construction -Test Methods and Standard Practices are now posted on the CSA website for public review comments (see link below).

Everyone in the Canadian concrete industry is required to meet these mandatory minimum requirements, so this is your opportunity to make comment on the deliberations of the committee and to voice your concerns (if not already addressed).

You must follow the CSA procedures to submit your comments or they may be dismissed.

The Public review closes on April 8th, so don't forget to submit your comments before then.

[Government of Alberta Apprenticeship Announcement](#)

The Government of Alberta is now requiring proponents bidding on Alberta Infrastructure and Alberta Transportation projects to submit an apprenticeship plan that details how they intend to use apprentices.

Procurements that require an apprentice plan will clearly identify this requirement on the Notice of Procurement, on the front page of the tender documents and within those documents.

- Apprentices are required to participate on major public projects with budgets of more than \$15 million, or those that will require at least two years to complete.
- A minimum of one apprentice position is also required for each applicable sub-contract valued at \$500,000 or greater.
- The successful bidder is required to report to Advanced Education on outcomes.
