Arc Flash & Shock Electrical Safety Training based on CSA Z462-2015 Developed for workers that perform energized electrical work. The course curriculum is based on the 3rd edition of CSA Z462, published in 2015. The overall course content was developed using industry accepted best practice standards as the under pinning in support of meeting Provincial or Federal regulatory due diligence for arc flash and shock.

ESTS Electrical Worker training is focused on the practical application of CSA Z462 within the workplace and providing documentation tools in support of the Employer's overall Occupational Health & Safety Management System and an Electrical Safety Program. Employers are required to have an updated Electrical Safety Program that incorporates the new requirements from CSA Z462-2015 for workers to receive the most benefit from this course.

Alberta Construction Association Update

ACA Requests Consultation On Overtime Averaging Agreement

ACA has sent a letter to the Minister or Labour outlining industry's concerns regarding overtime averaging agreement. In the past few months since bill 30 came into law construction employees and employers have raised significant concerns in regards to the overtime and averaging agreement provisions. In particular, both groups are concerned that the present 44 hour per week and up to 12 week averaging agreement period are not sufficiently flexible to accommodate the site-specific, project-based, seasonal nature of construction work.

Spring 2018 has illustrated the impact of weather on the ability for many construction workers to work any hours at all. Wet, cold, high winds, darkness, all impact the amount of hours to safely perform duties.

Further, construction projects may be remote from a worker's residence, taking the worker away from their family. While they are away, they prefer to maximize hours of work to then bank for use at other times.

Our employers report that their employees are requesting the flexibility to safely work longer days over an entire season to address these issues.

ACA would like to see an exception for the industry similar to [Manitoba legislation](#) which allows for a longer work week to apply over the entire season.

Become Informed On OHS Changes

On June 1, three new OHS rules come into force. The Worker's right to know potential hazards, the right to refuse dangerous work and the right to participate in their health and safety.

Changes to Alberta's workplace health and safety laws were passed late last year. This spring, government consulted with employers, workers' advocates and Albertans on specific rules regarding harassment and violence, as well as the operation of joint work site health and safety committees. The consultation concluded on April 9. An Order in Council signed April 23 spells out those details.

On Friday, April 20, 2017, the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board Awards honored top apprentices in Alberta. ACA honored two of those top achievers with specialty awards.

Dustin Thomson, from Calgary, received the ACA W.G. Alexander Memorial award for being the Top Overall Construction Apprentice in 2017. ACA awarded Jarred Pinda, from Red Deer, the ACA Top Carpenter Award for 2017.

ACA's 2017 two top Apprentices received their congratulations along with Northern Lights Bear glass sculptures and a cheque for \$500.

Government of Alberta Announces New PACE Legislation

If passed, An Act to Enable Clean Energy Improvements would give municipalities the option to establish a **Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program**. The initiative would allow home and business owners to make their spaces more energy-efficient, without putting any money down. ACA lobbied for the introduction of PACE programming for Alberta to increase market opportunities for our members.

"ACA feels strongly that PACE programs offer a financially viable way to retrofit older buildings, or for new buildings to meet future environmental standards. It also offers a method for investment which does not create costs to the taxpayer," said Paul Verhesen, Past Chair, Alberta Construction Association.

Financing for energy-efficient upgrades or renewable energy systems such as solar panels, high-insulation windows and high-efficiency heating and cooling systems would be repaid through the building owner's property taxes. Often, the savings generated by the PACE upgrades would be greater than the annual repayment.

The PACE program would also stimulate local economies and help create jobs. In North America, every \$1 million in PACE project spending has resulted in at least 15 new jobs and \$2.5 million in economic output. Since first implemented in California in 2008, PACE programs have expanded to every region in the United States, generating nearly \$6 billion in economic activity. A number of Canadian jurisdictions, including Ontario, Nova Scotia and Quebec, have also adopted PACE legislation, increasing economic activity and creating local jobs.
